Adoption Orientation meetings

These meetings held regularly are focused on interaction between Prospective adoptive parents (PAP) & adoptive parents. The interaction is aimed at allaying apprehensions, doubts in the mind of PAPs. The adoptive parents share their adoption experiences.

The effectiveness of our orientation meetings is evident from the interaction and participation of the parents. We experienced a high level of engagement in the meetings held during the period of reporting. The topics covered were -

- Discussion on the short videos shared with the group prior to the meeting. The video covers
 foster care for children in IAPA's care, an adoptive parent's expression and that by a young,
 adopted person)
- Changes in the guidelines laid down by CARA including the change in the website from www.cara.nic.in to www.cara.wcd.gov.in
- Resource persons shared their experiences with anecdotes on attachment issues, social and emotional attachment with adopted child, school challenges and other emotional health matters.

The social worker emphasised on the importance of Medical Examination Report (MER) and Child Study Report (CSR), highlighting the concerns parents have over any serious ailments, physical or psychological condition of the child.

Covering the post adoption concerns, the process of sharing the fact of adoption and root search was discussed.

Current challenges in Foster Care

IAPA is currently struggling with receiving children in the 0-6 years age group due to a clause in the Vatsalya scheme of the Government of India. Our efforts are on to discuss the importance of family care for children in this age group.

Enhancing the skills & knowledge

IAPA makes the most of opportunities for enhancing the skills and knowledge of the staff. Ongoing training in the areas of adoption, foster care, Bal Sangopan, fund raising, Annual-report writing were attended. IAPA social workers were also invited to make presentations in their areas of expertise. Orienting college students about our programmes and activities is a regular feature. We have been fortunate to have social work and psychology students from reputed universities connect with us for internships. These connects are mutually beneficial.

Annual Family Get-together

Annual Family Meet was held on 17th February 2024. All parents & children who have been a part of IAPA, past & prospective were invited as every year. As families walked in, they were welcomed with a goody bag (cookies, biscuits & chocolates) for the children and a potted plant for the parents. While waiting for the programme to start, children got their desired tattoos painted in water colors on their hands by a Tattoo artist. The selfie corner with the logo of IAPA as a backdrop helped parents to create special memories. The celebration started with the welcome address by Mr. Sanjay Chore, President of IAPA. He welcomed all and spoke about his relation with IAPA as an adoptive parent first and then as a member of the IAPA Executive Committee. He also encouraged families to support IAPA in kind and cash.

This was followed with the favourite activity of children - bursting of balloons.

The magic show by magician Charlie had children and parents completely enthralled. The evening gained momentum with a few children coming up to the stage to display their talents. Everyone enjoyed songs and dance performances. The on-stage conversation with grown up adopted persons was a guiding point for parents who have begun sharing the facts of adoption with their children. Sharing about how one young person coped with her feelings when dealing with the knowledge of being adopted and how delicately the fact of adoption was shared through a beautiful story by the other young person's mother caught everyone's attention.

Karan Solanki's choreography on Bollywood songs had the children, parents and IAPA staff shaking their legs.

The happy evening culminated with relishing snacks for all present. A fulfilling program moved the hearts of everyone present at the venue. A very emotional and proud moment for the parents!!!

Child Guidance Centre

The Child Guidance Center - Aastha (at our Khetwadi office) addresses the emotional health concerns of the children and their family members. Some highlights

- Sessions were conducted with the students of Std. 1 to 7 on a multitude of topics handling emotions, friendship, respect and confidence, establishing connection with inner self and understanding the nuances of nonverbal communication. The crucial topics of phone addiction and substance abuse were also covered.
- As a follow up, a session was held with the parents of these children on challenges in parenting, communication with the child, importance of daily quality time with the children, being aware of children's feelings. The parents were also told about how their children spend time at the center. They got to understand the effectiveness of the activities the children get involved in.

Remedial Sessions were conducted with a group of students focusing on communication, group dynamics and interaction, self-acceptance, being attentive, taking initiative and experiencing emotions.

All the activities included self-introductions, expressing likes and dislikes, drawing unique shapes to emphasize individuality, and a freeze dance to illustrate diverse emotional expressions.

Expressive Therapy Sessions - a successful initiative

You want to witness activity, enthusiasm and a pleasant atmosphere? Be a part of the sessions conducted for and with children. The one-to-one sessions with children (and their parents) at Aastha covered academic, behavioral, emotional and physical concerns. Our counselling psychologist initiated **Expressive therapy** for the children that offers a valuable remedial approach to supporting children in their emotional development. It also enhances the potential in them. We are happy to report that Expressive Therapy sessions with the children are showing positive results!

A group of students from Std. 3 to 7 are undergoing Expressive Therapy for Improved **Emotional Identification** and **Self-Expression**. This therapeutic intervention is aimed to enhance the children's ability to identify and express emotions effectively. Another aim is to develop coping mechanisms once the emotions are identified. This is done through the use of creative modalities like art, music, and movement. After consistent 20 such individual and group sessions, the children are seen to have developed a better understanding of their own emotions and those of their group members. They are seen to approach situations with confidence, and creativity.

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

Success stories (names changed to maintain confidentiality)

Story of Pari - Not losing hope

Pari was studying in a Municipal school of Mumbai. She was a thin & malnourished girl born to parents who are blind. Her mother sells pickles, papads to make a living. Her father sells incense sticks, but does not contribute towards household expenses. Pari has an elder sister who is already under the sponsorship of IAPA. Pari's mother was more worried about Pari, since she was not good in her studies & she had learning difficulties. Above all, family didn't have a great financial support, the mother was the sole breadwinner, shouldering the responsibility of bringing up the daughters. That is when Pari was referred to IAPA, Child Guidance center. Intense counseling sessions were held with Pari & her mother. This timely intervention, gradually helped Pari to cope with her learning disabilities. Pari could establish a very good rapport with the IAPA Social worker. Pari started getting IAPA sponsorship for continuing her studies. Pari's mother was also given a packing machine from IAPA, for increasing her work & thereby enhancing the economic status of the family. Pari could successfully complete her 10th & 12th studies securing good marks. She had a desire to do Fashion Designing course which she could complete securing A grade with the financial support of IAPA. Pari successfully completed her internship, and today is working in a private firm. She is a great moral & financial support to her family now.

Story of Naina - Overcoming hardships

Naina lives in a shanty of Mumbai. Her father was a sweeper in a municipal office. He was habituated to drinking alcohol & had also contracted AIDS. He died of multiple ailments later. Fortunately, Naina & her mother tested negative for AIDS. Since Naina's father was very irregular in his work, he was dismissed from his job. So when he died, Naina & her mother did not get any compensation. Naina's mother was only a housewife earlier, she had to earn money for survival. So, she took up a small-time job in a printing press to make ends meet. Naina's mother had the responsibility of taking care of her old mother-in-law (Naina's grandmother). Difficult family circumstances forced mother to keep Naina in institutional care. So she filed an application with the Child Welfare Committee, Mumbai. The Committee referred Naina to IAPA for educational support. This support helped prevent Naina from staying in a shelter home. She continued to stay with her mother. Since Naina was a brilliant student in school, she continued with her studies & stood first in her SSC examination in her school. She passed her 12th too with flying colors securing 93%. Naina was given continual counseling, guidance & educational support by IAPA social worker. Naina pursued her B. Com & Company Secretary course simultaneously. Her intense hard work paid off & she could complete both the courses successfully. Naina got placed in a CA firm as trainee. She did not stop here. With the continued support of IAPA she could pursue her LLB course too. In the year 2023, she could successfully complete her LLB with a brilliant score of 83%. Today, Naina is Company Secretary cum a Legal Advisor in a reputed firm in Mumbai. Really a proud moment for Naina, her mother & IAPA. Naina gives full credit to IAPA or her super brilliant achievement...
